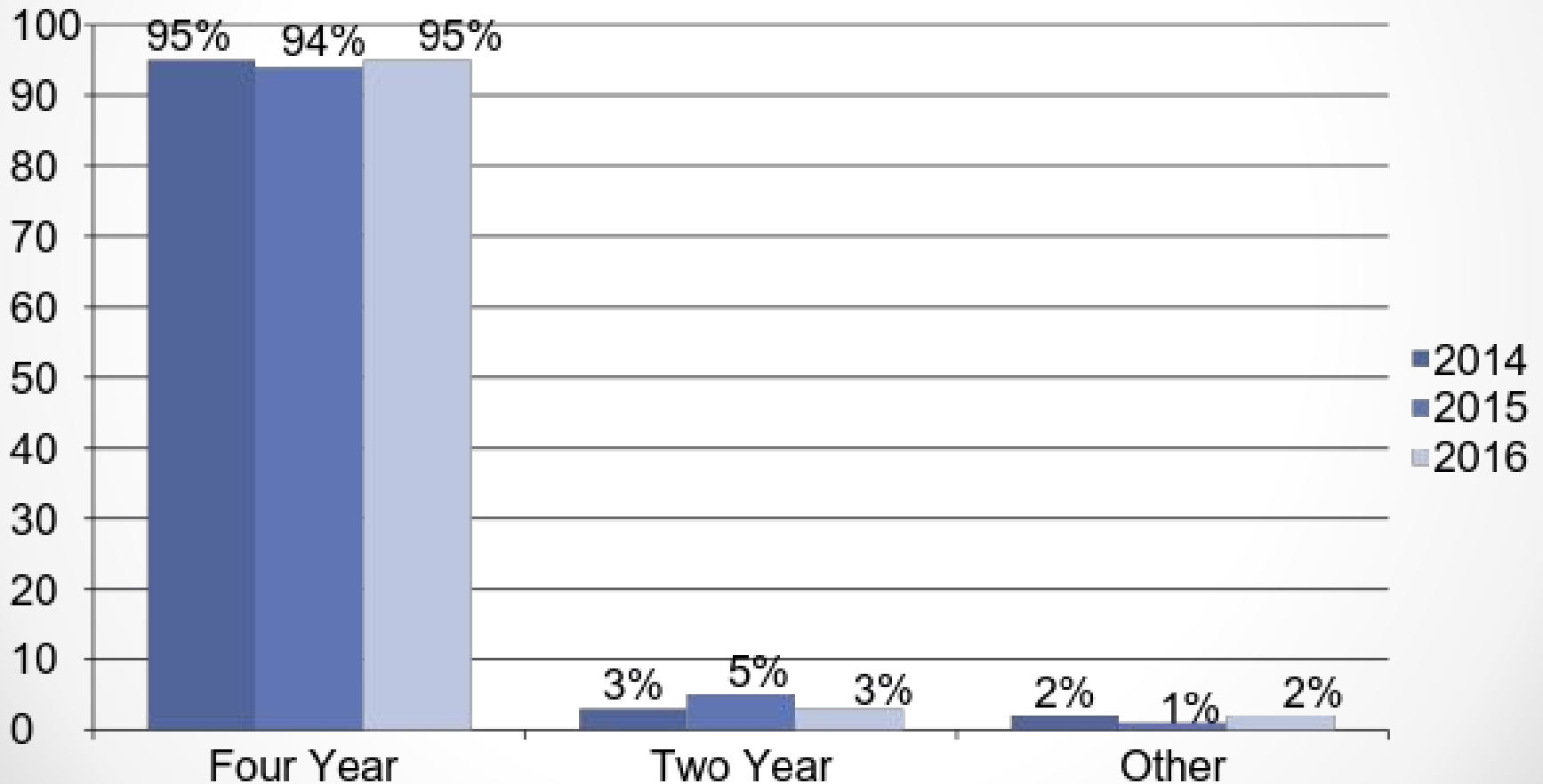



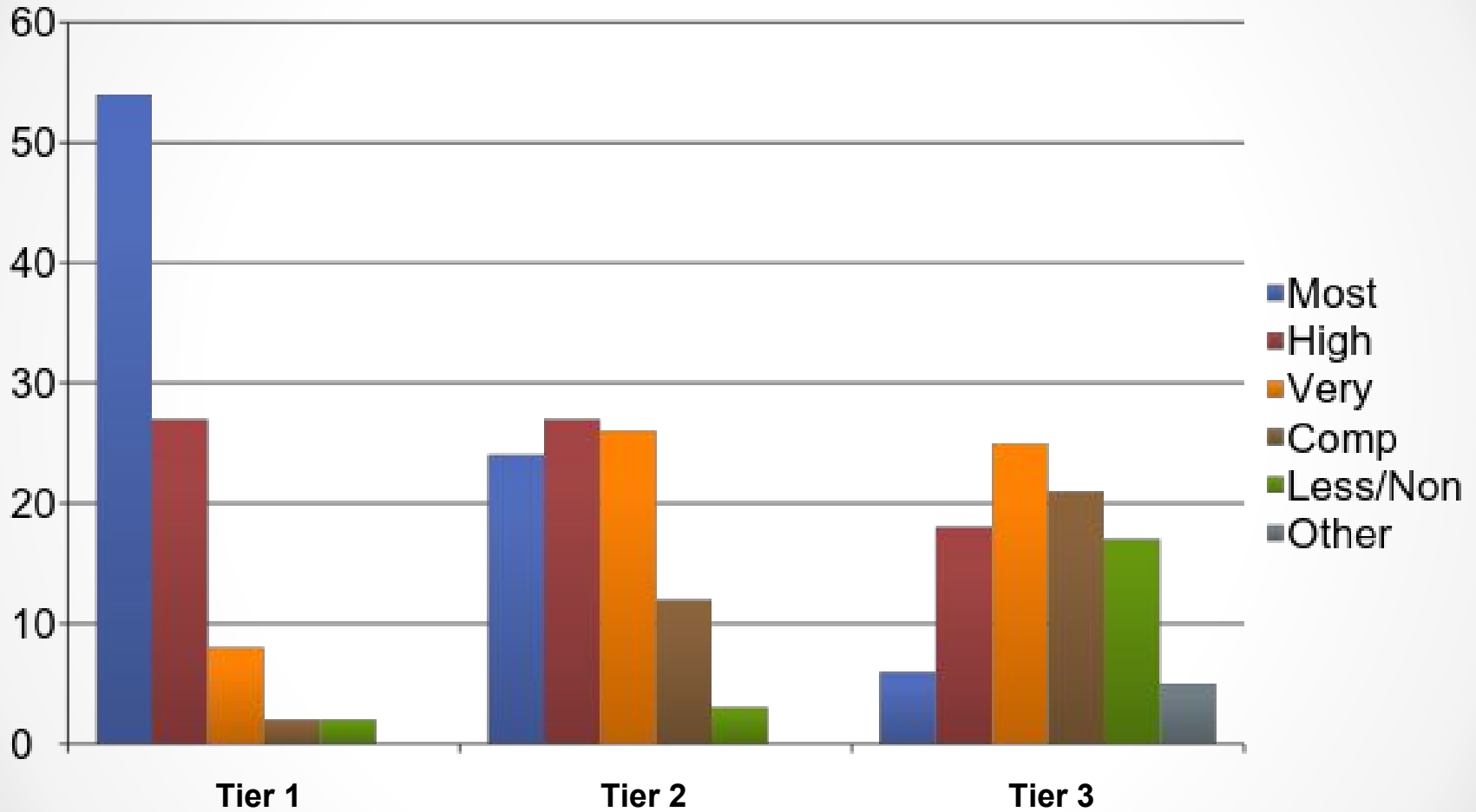

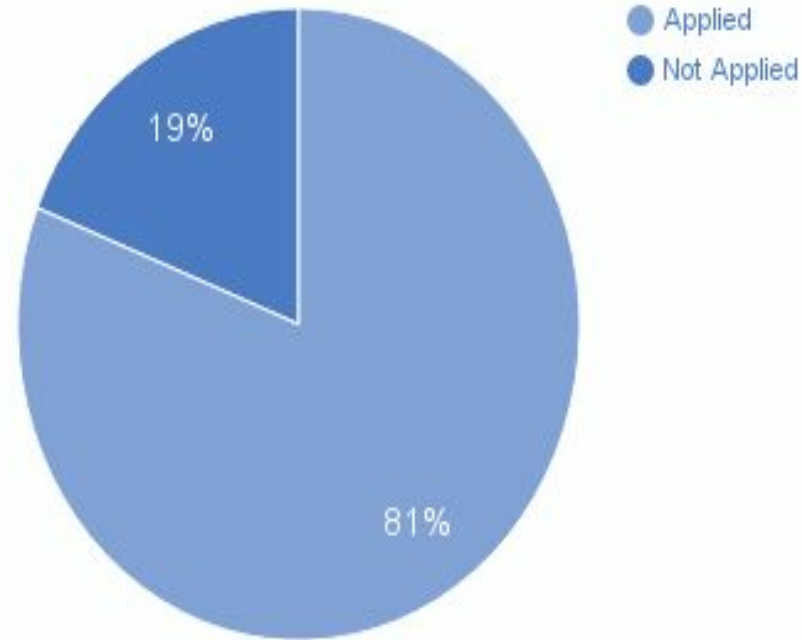

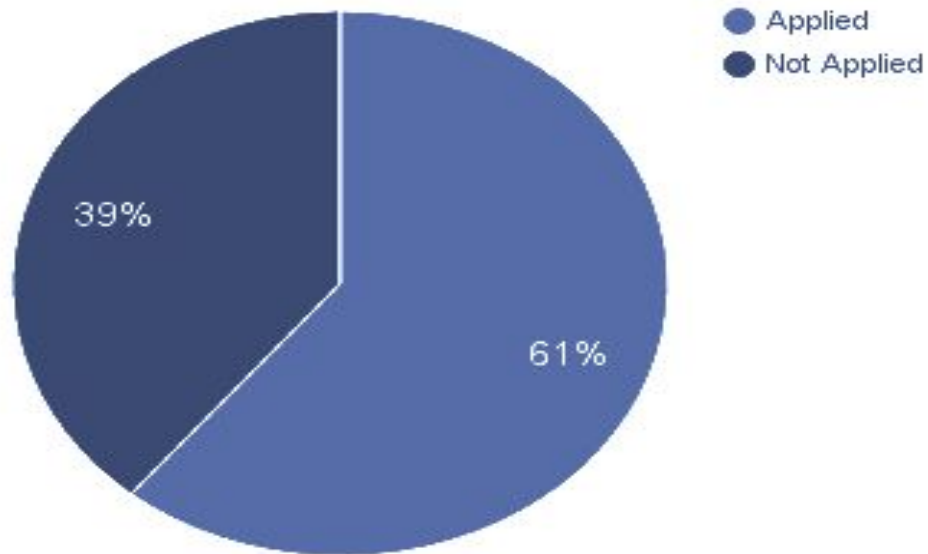
Percentage of Schools Applied

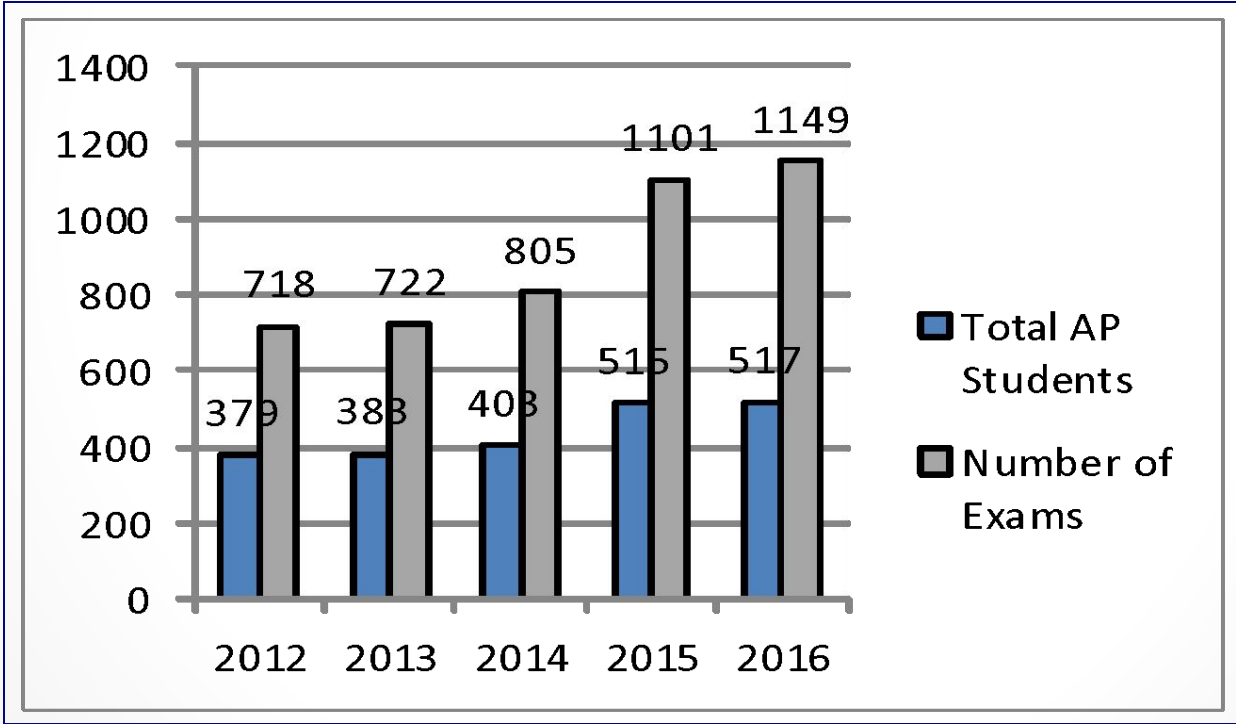

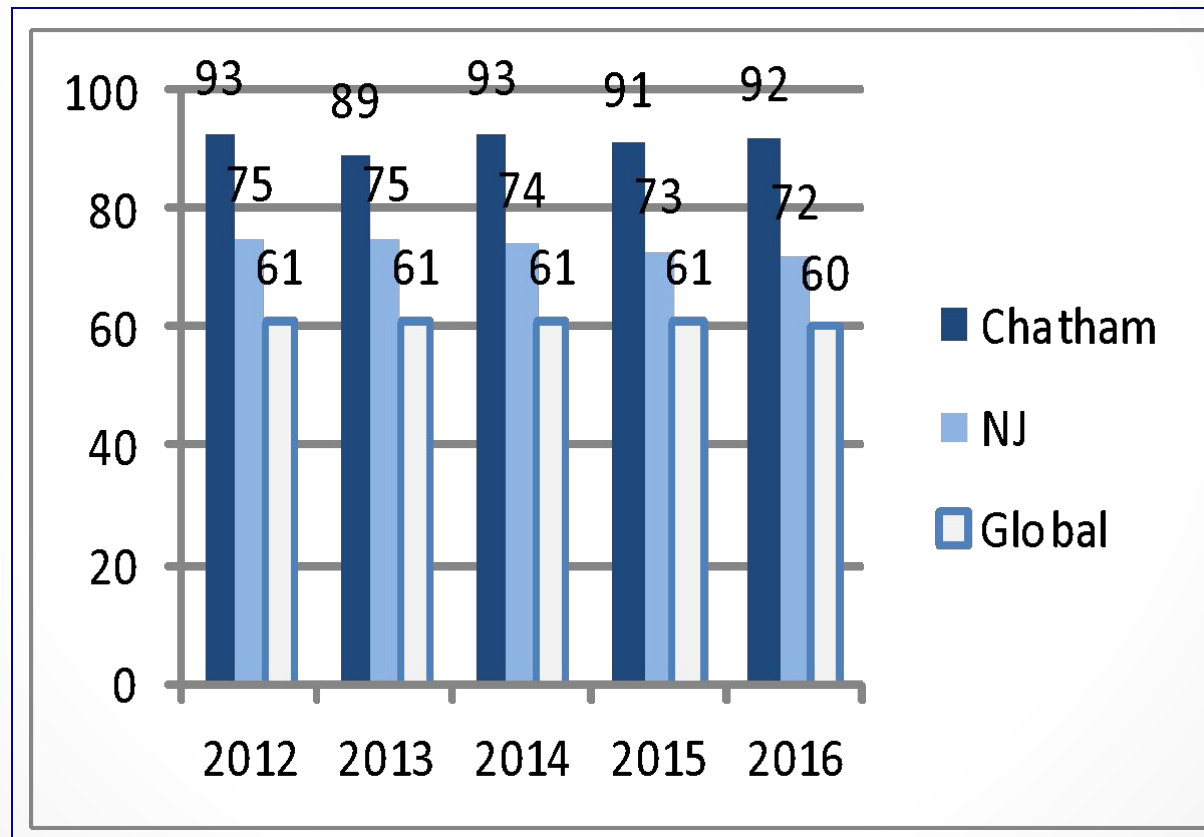

Number of AP Students and Exams Completed



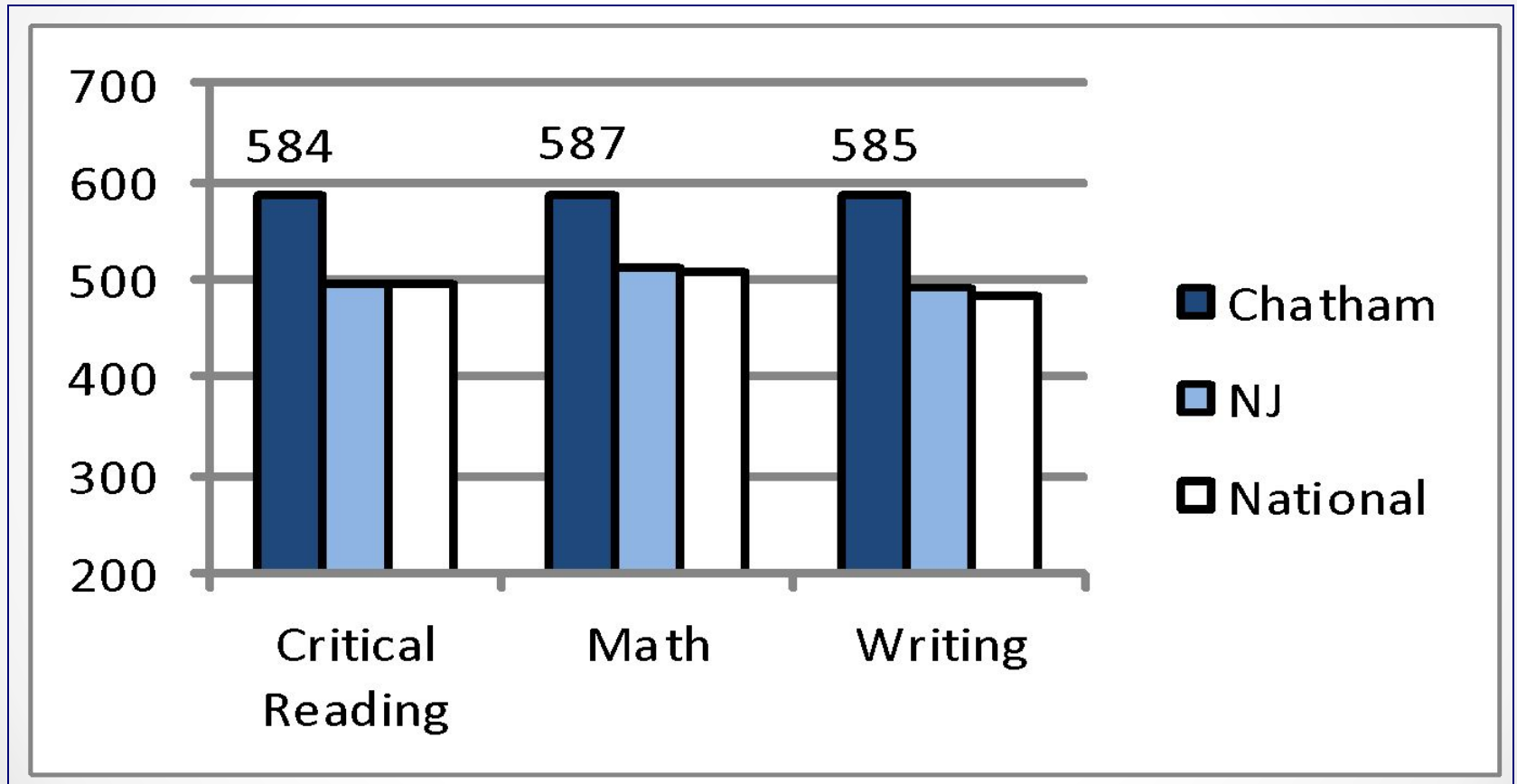
Percentage of Students Scoring 3 or Higher



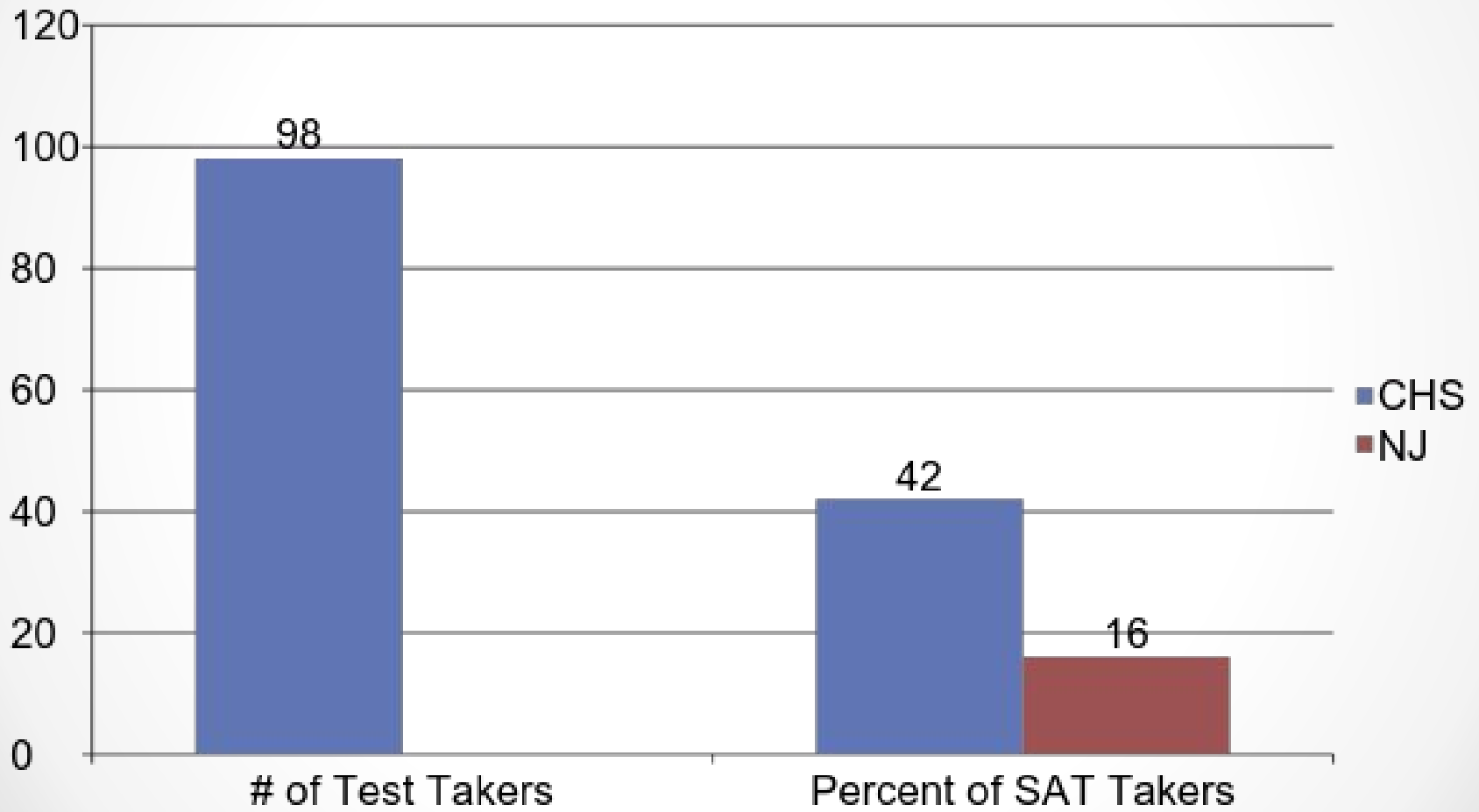

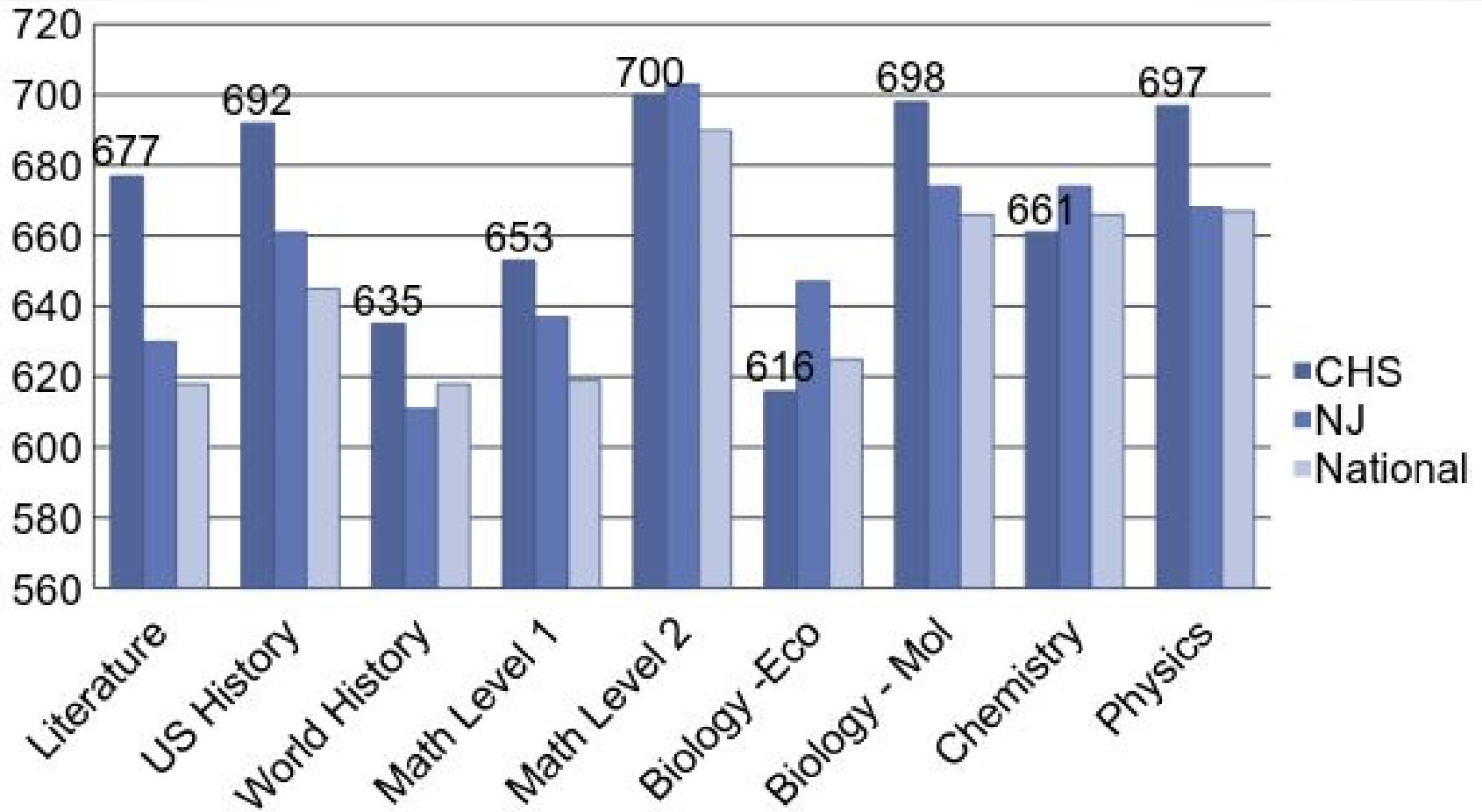
Mean SAT Scores, Class of 2016



SAT Subject Tests

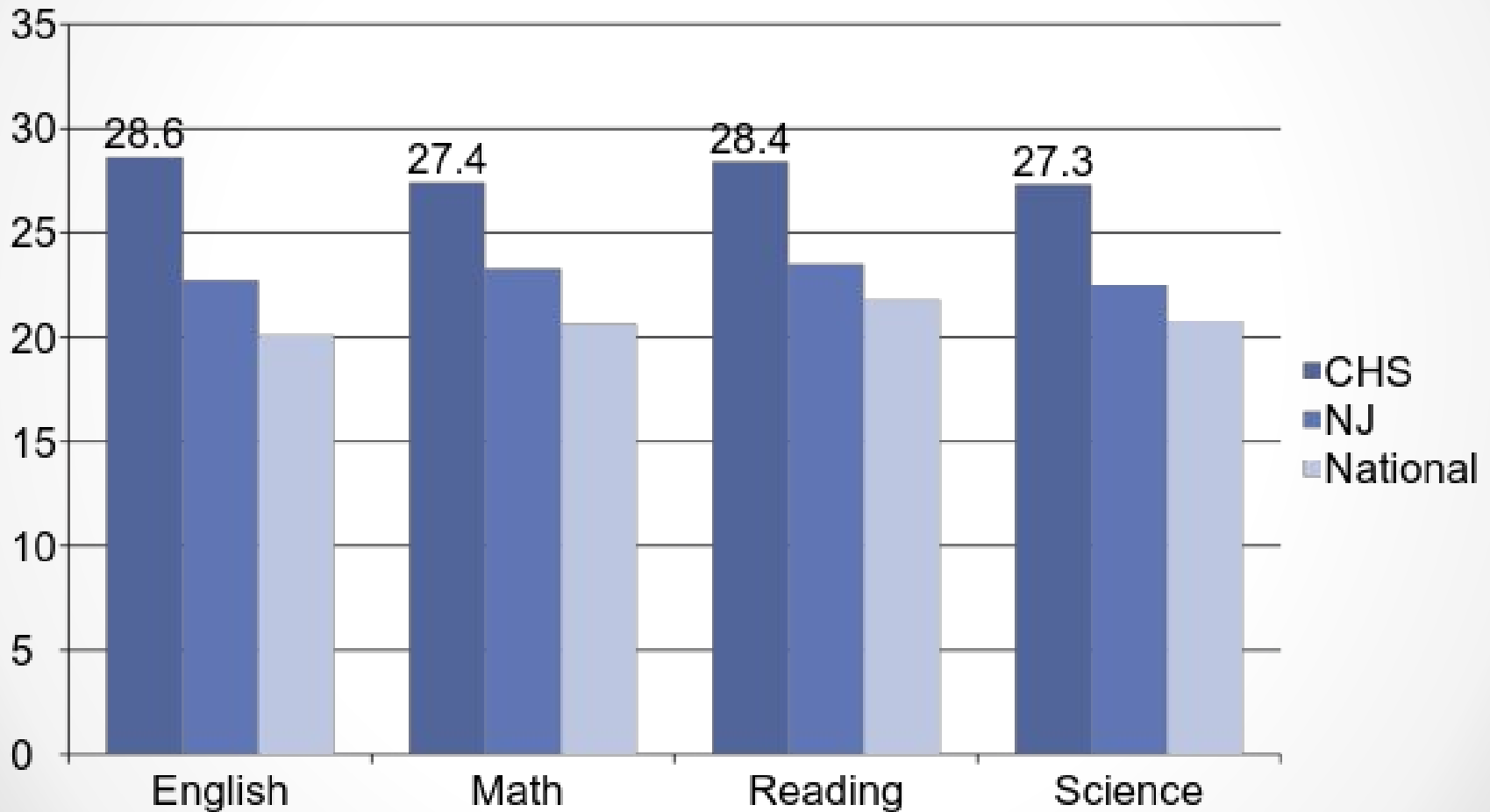


Mean Scores SAT Subject Tests
