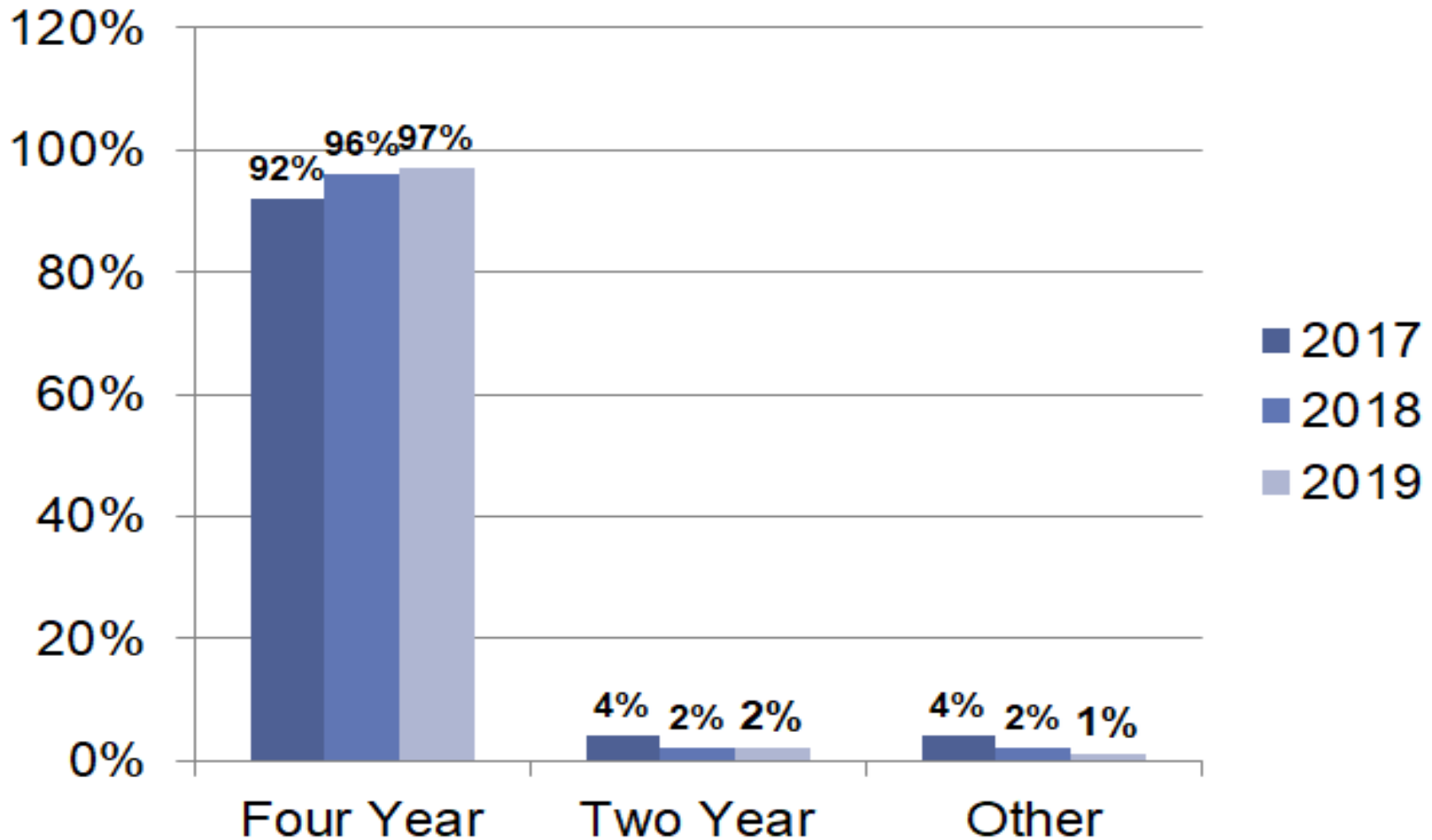



College Placement by GPA

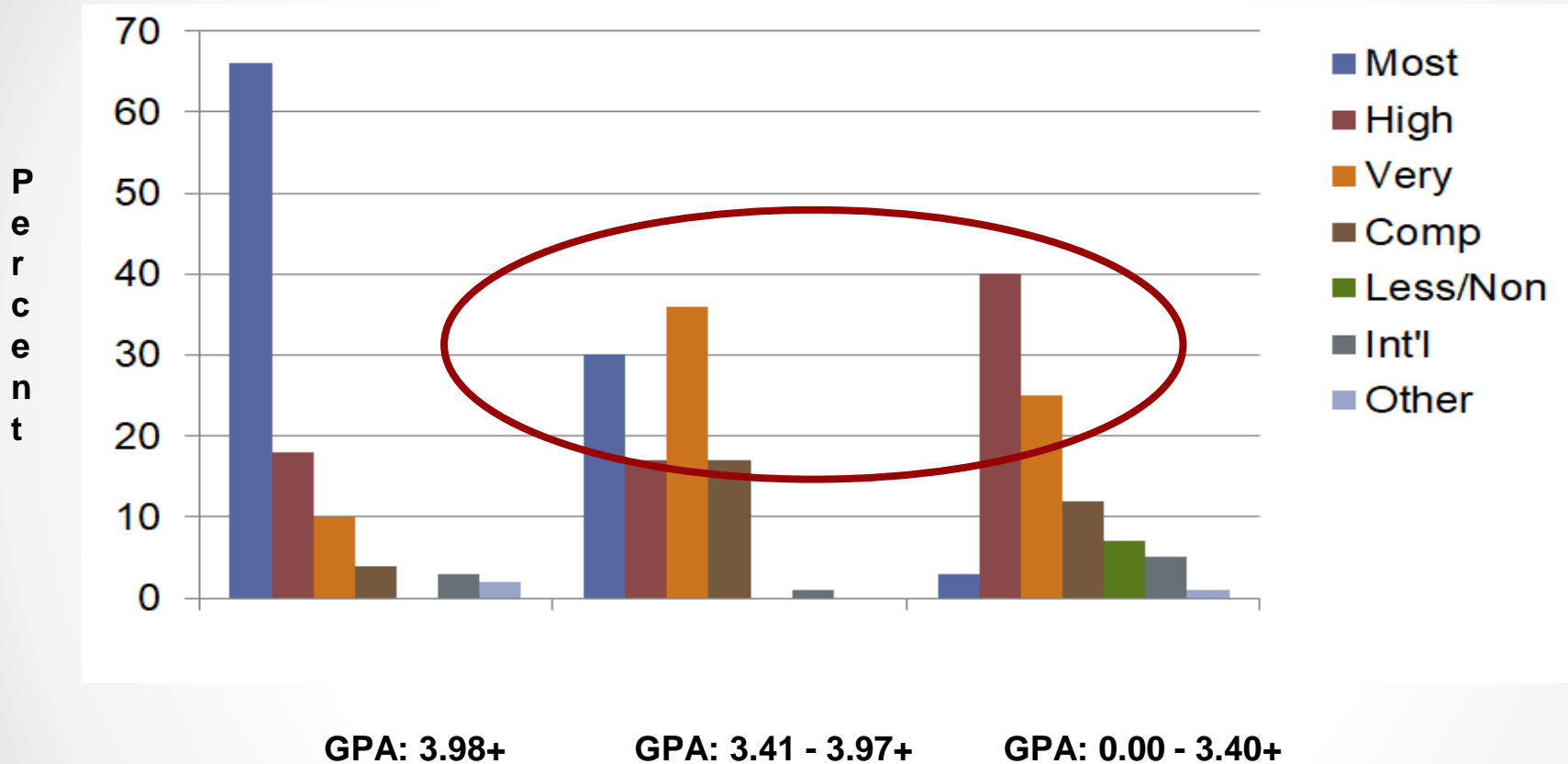
Area of Focus: Help students and families see that ALL students have a range of options.

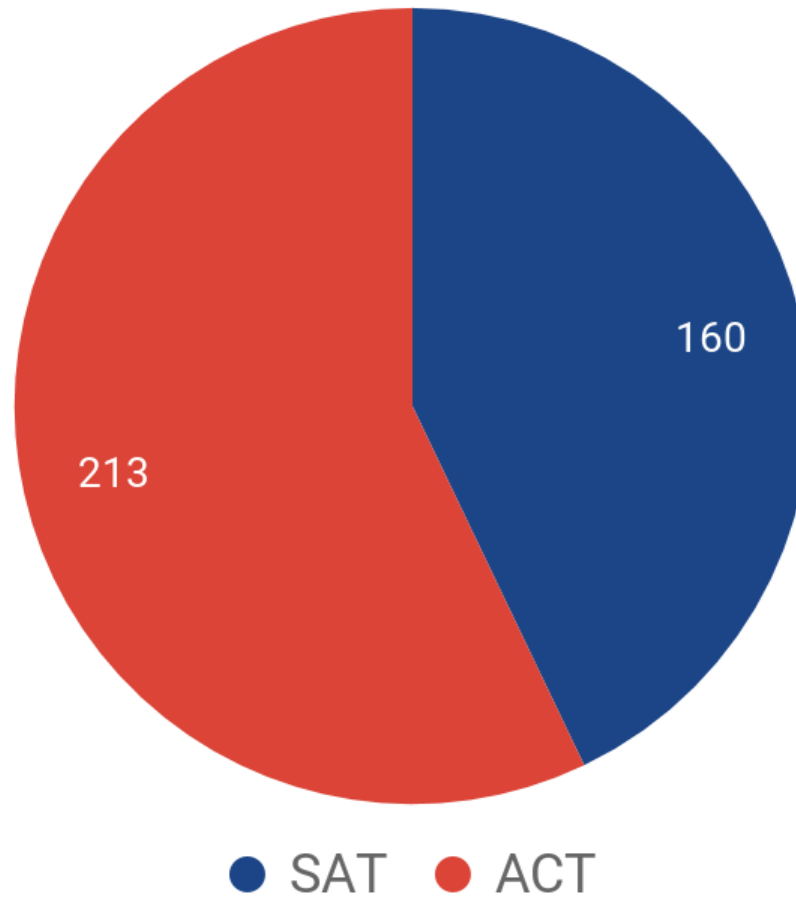

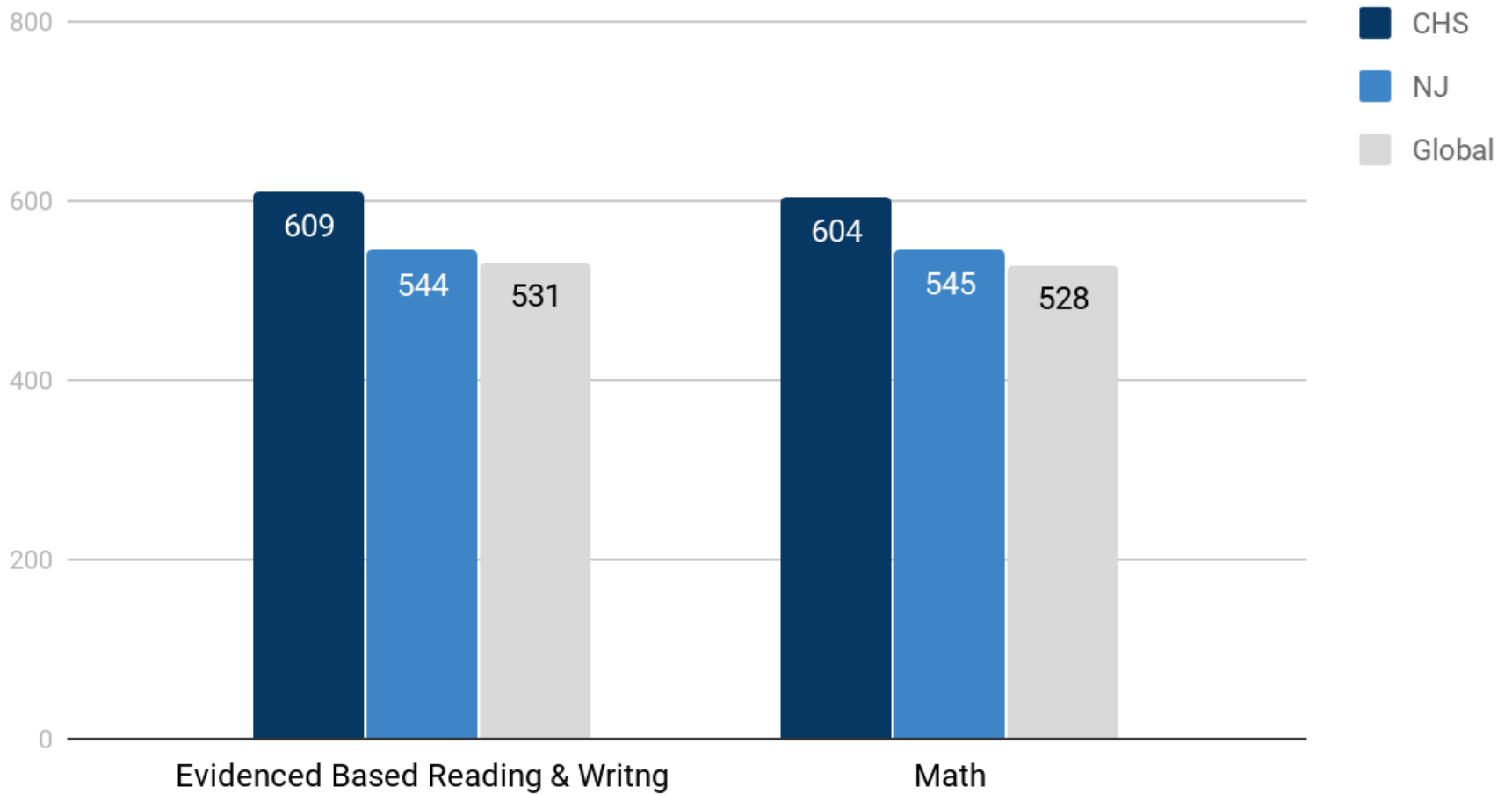

ACT and SAT Class of 2019- Total Students

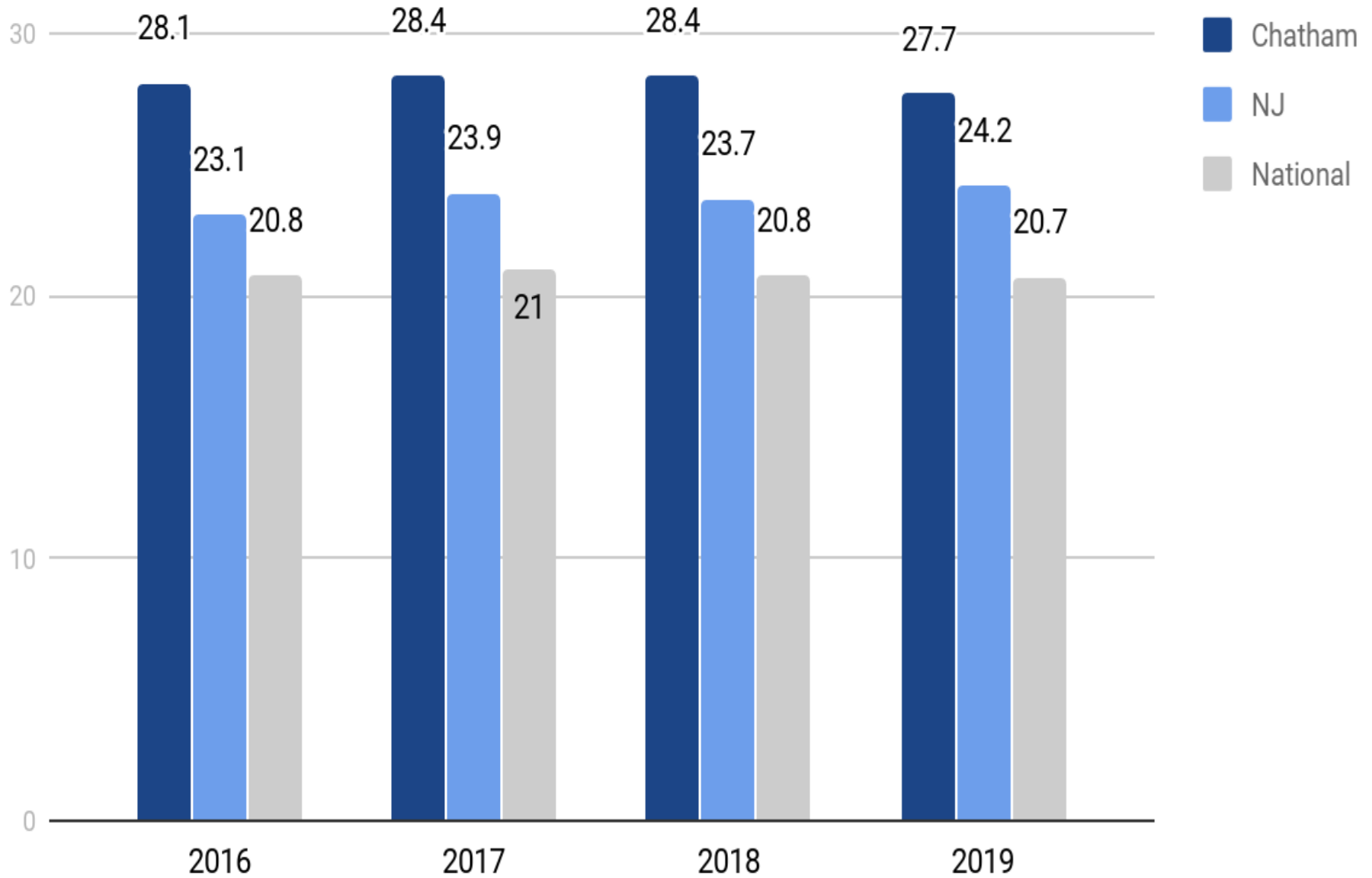


Mean SAT Scores, Class of 2019

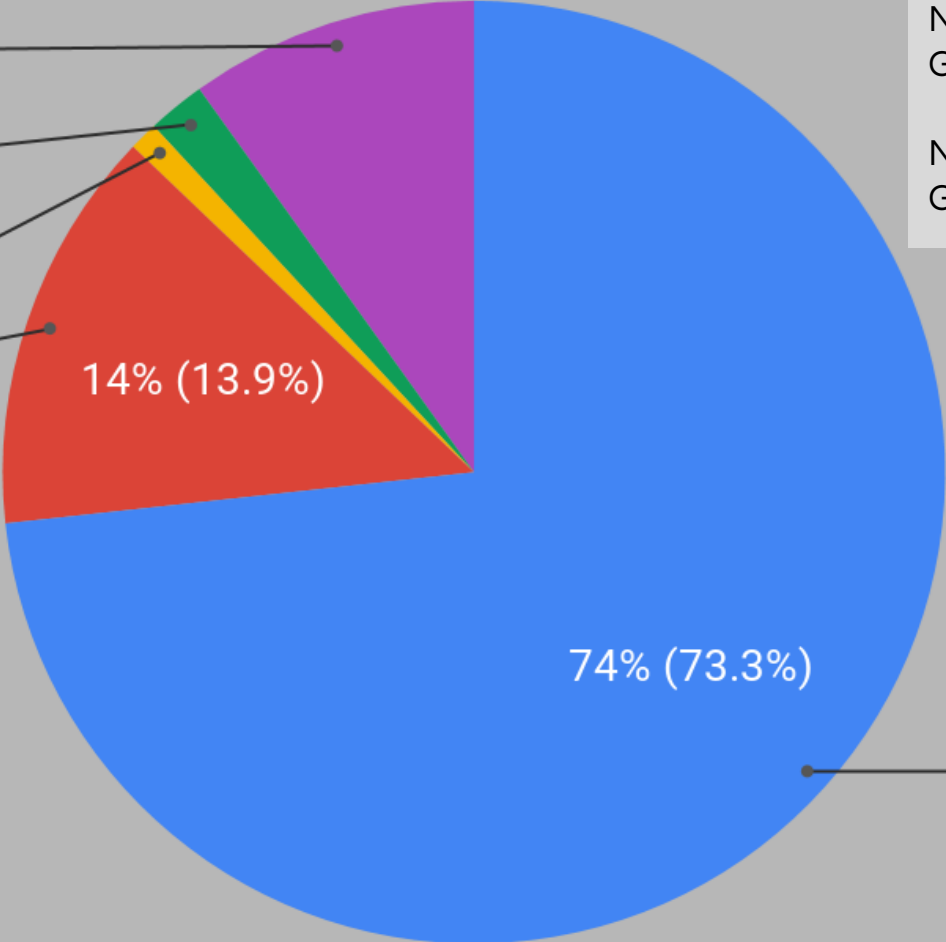

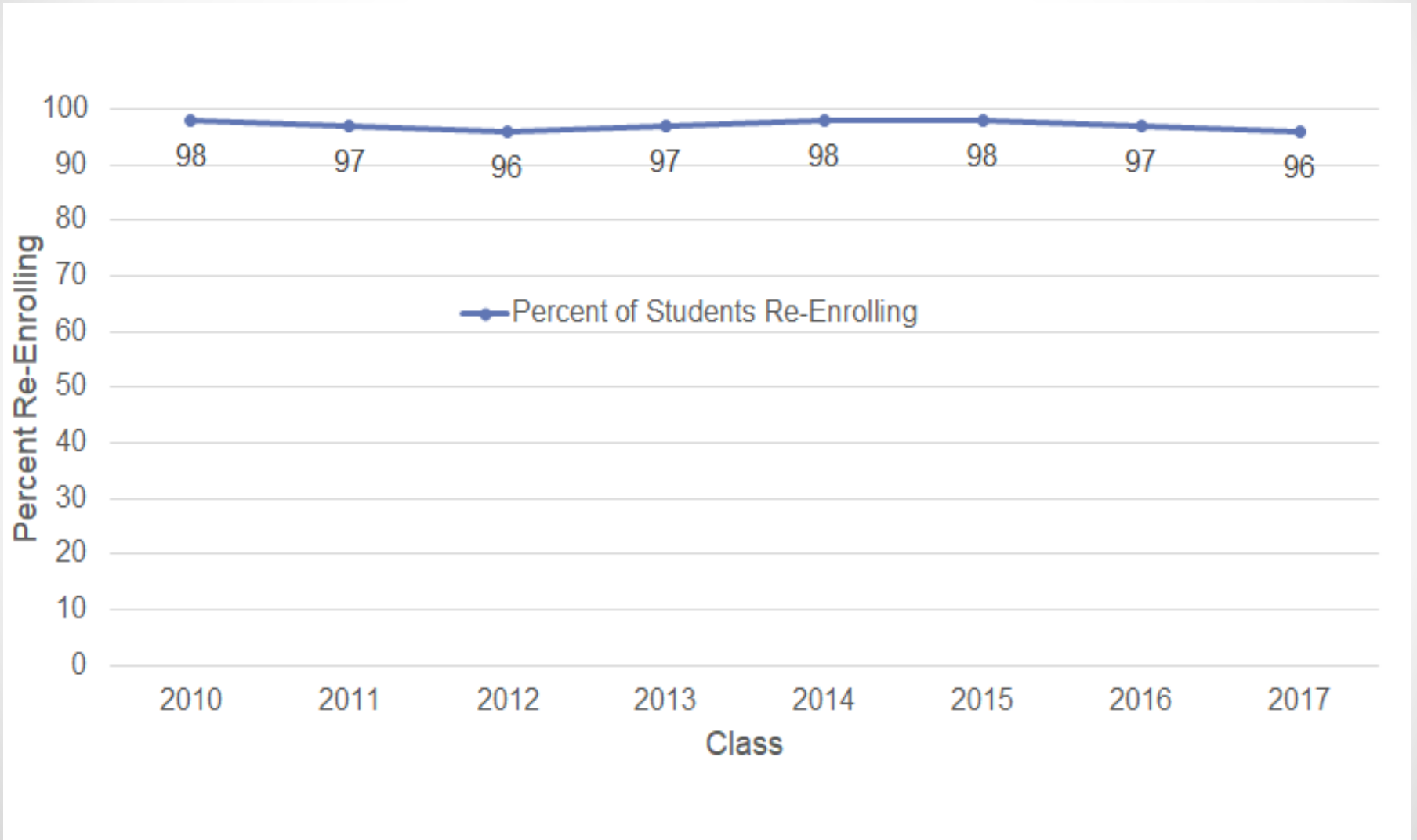
National Four Year
